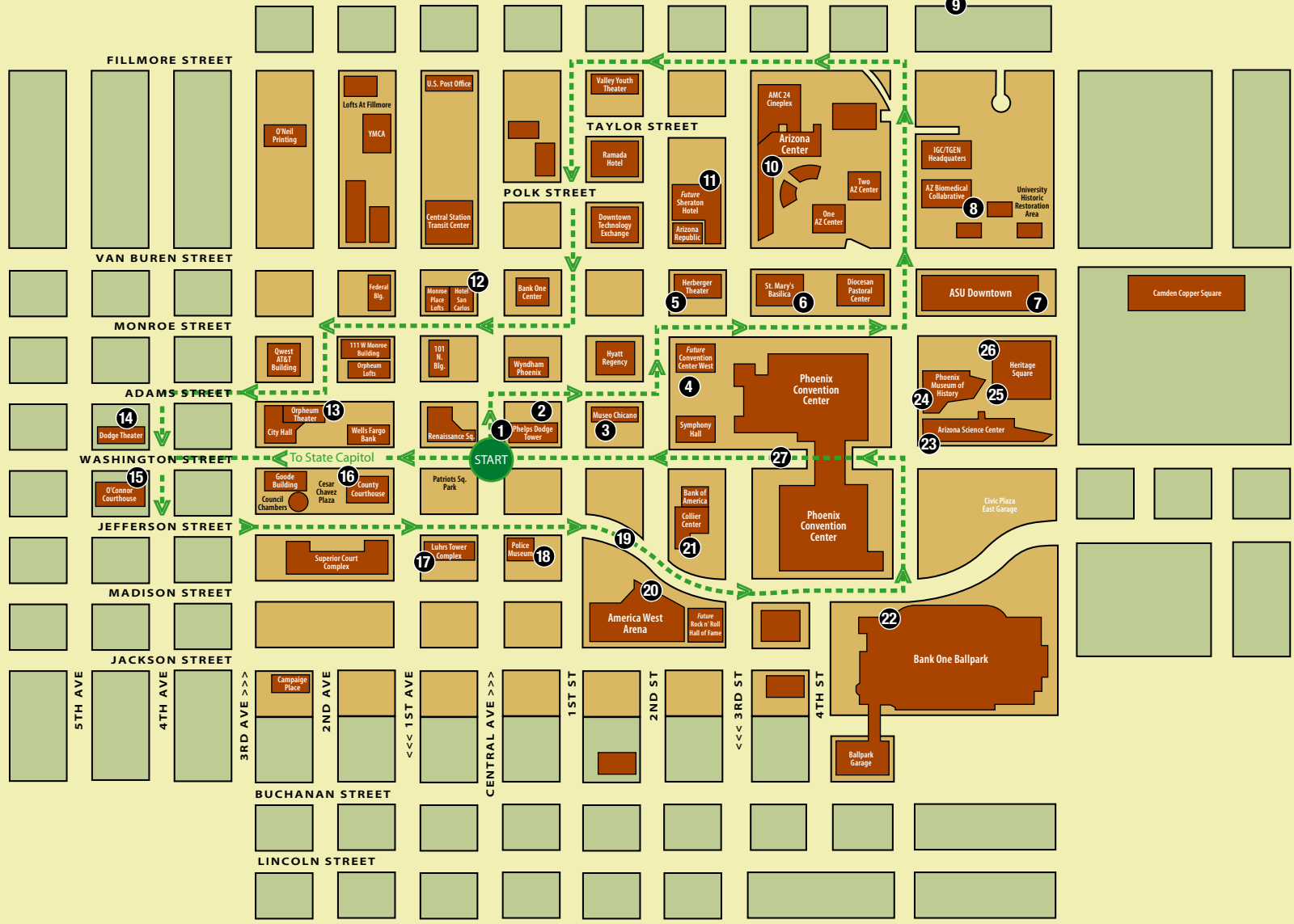

WALKING TOUR

Major Sights of Copper Square

Starting From Central & Washington

• Center of Phoenix

1 Light Rail alignment (northbound on Central Ave)

- Major utility relocation work has already begun
- Alignment is 21 miles +/- operational by late 2008
- Connecting to Sky Harbor Airport
- Connect Copper Square to ASU Main Campus, tying it to the ASU -Downtown Campus

2 Hanny's Building (44 N. 1st Street)

- Built in 1947
- One of the last big department stores in Downtown

3 Museo Chicano (147 E. Adams Street)

- Latino Arts, history and culture museum open Tuesday-Saturday from 10am – 4pm

4 Civic Plaza Expansion & Symphony Hall Renovation (2nd Street & Adams)

- \$600 million state & city financed project.
- Triples size of existing facility to nearly 900,000 square feet of rentable space when completed in '08
- Positions Phoenix in the top 20 nationally for convention center exhibition space
- Phase I (West Building/Symphony Hall Renovation) underway. Symphony Hall completion in Fall 2005, West Building completion in Spring 2006
- Phase II (North Building) complete in late 2008, Phase III (South Building Interior Renovations) complete by mid 2009
- Civic Plaza will continue operation throughout construction, with no loss of floor space at any time

5 Herberger Theater (222 E. Monroe)

- State of the art venue with multiple facilities built in 1989
- Host to performing arts and cultural education
- Home to four resident companies: Actors Theatre, Arizona Theatre Company, Center Dance Ensemble and Childsplay

6 St. Mary's Basilica (231 N. 3rd St)

- Phoenix's oldest Catholic Church, dedicated in 1915
- Diocesan Pastoral Center completed in 2003 (including garden area)
- Daily services
- Gift Shop open daily

7 ASU Downtown Phoenix (502 E. Monroe)

- Current location for ASU downtown programs
- Future plans may incorporate site into the adjacent Phoenix Biomedical Center at Copper Square
- Future development of an approximate 15,000 student campus by approximately 2016 within the area bounded by 1st Avenue, 3rd Street, Van Buren and Central Avenue. The first 2,500 students expected to arrive in Fall 2006
- Expected to be an integrated, urban campus utilizing existing buildings as well as new structures.

8 Phoenix Biomedical Center at Copper Square

- Headquarters to the Translational Genomics Research Institute (Tgen) and International Genomics Consortium (IGC) at 445 N. 5th Street. 170,000 Square foot building opened in March of 2005
- Bioscience Research Facility w/ a design concept of open labs, research neighborhoods and scien-

tific interaction

- Construction of Medical School (Phoenix Biomedical Campus of the Arizona University System) underway
- 15 acre site bounded by 7th Street / 5th Street / Van Buren / Pierce
- Ultimately home to one million square feet of biomedical research and education space.

9 Science High School (Pierce to McKinley, 5th St to 6th St)

- Renovate McKinley School to create a 4 year bioscience high school which will accommodate approximately 400 students
- Phoenix Union High School District school
- Scheduled to open in August of 2006

10 Arizona Center (455 N 3rd Street)

- Office, retail, entertainment and restaurant space completed in 1990
- Public Garden area

11 Future Convention Center Hotel (NWC of 3rd St & Van Buren)

- 30+ stories, 1,000 room hotel, two restaurants
- 65,000 SF of meeting space, health & fitness facilities, retail space and other amenities
- Owned by the City of Phoenix and operated by Sheraton
- Construction to begin early '07
- Coincide w/ the completion of the North Building at the Civic Plaza in 2008

12 Hotel San Carlos (202 N. Central Ave)

- Historic boutique hotel in Downtown Phoenix completed in 1928
- The hotel was a gathering place for residents a Hollywood movie stars.

- This Renaissance Revival building was one of the first hotels to have steam heat, elevators and air-cooling.
- Hosts Ghost Tours of Downtown Phoenix most weekends

13 Orpheum Theatre (203 W. Adams Street)

- Phoenix's only remaining historic palace theatre
- Underwent major restoration in 1997
- Spanish Colonial Revival Architecture
- Broadway musical theatre, dance and other performing arts

14 Dodge Theatre (400 W. Washington Street)

- State of the Art live performance venue hosting concerts, comedians, Broadway Theatre, family shows, Boxing and more
- 5,000 seat multipurpose completed in 2002

15 Sandra Day O'Connor Federal Courthouse

- (401 W. Washington St)
- Unique architecture completed in 2000
- Over 486,000 SF w/ glass atrium
- Innovative cooling system that combines evaporation and convection strategies

16 Historic City Hall (17 S. 2nd Ave) & Maricopa

- County Courthouse
- Completed in 1928
- Still functions as a courthouse & office space

17 Luhrs Office Center (13 W. Jefferson St) & Tower

- (45 W. Jefferson St)
- Built in 1923-24 (Tower added in 1929)
- The bank scene in the movie "Psycho" was filmed at this location
- At the time of construction, they were the tallest buildings in AZ

- Unaltered buildings on original site

18 Phoenix Police Museum (101 S. Central Ave)

- Started in Historic City Hall in 1993 and was later moved to current location at the Barrister Building in 1995
- Exhibits from the 1800's to the present

19 Eastbound Light Rail Alignment

20 America West Arena (201 W. Jefferson St)

- Home of Phoenix Suns (NBA) & Phoenix Mercury (WNBA) Basketball, Arizona Rattlers (AFL) Football, Phoenix Roadrunners Hockey (ECHL), concerts and more
- Completed in 1992 with façade renovations & street level retail added in 2004
- Seats over 19,000

21 Hard Rock Café (3 S. 2nd Street)

- 8,000 SF of dining and entertainment space
- Opened in February of 2002
- Honors great names in rock n roll history and houses memorabilia from artist such as Cher, Justin Timberlake, Guns-n-Roses, the Rolling Stones and more

22 BankOne Ballpark (401 E. Jefferson St)

- Opened in Spring 1998
- Covers 1,300,000 SF including the playing surface & six seating levels
- Home of the 2001 World Champion Arizona Diamondbacks
- First facility in the world to combine a retractable roof, air conditioning and a natural turf field
- Host to such events as Major League Baseball, the Insight Bowl, Supercross, Monster Truck Shows, concerts, soccer, basketball, conventions,

- band pageants and religious gatherings.

23 Arizona Science Center (600 E. Washington St)

- Completed in 1997 with expansion of exhibit space completed in 2004
- Over 300 hand on exhibits, state of the art planetarium, giant screen theater, live demonstrations
- Houses exhibits such as Bond. James Bond, Whales, Galaxies and Forces of Nature

24 Phoenix Museum of History (105 N. 5th St)

- Opened in January 1996
- 20,000 SF facility that hosts a main gallery and changing exhibit
- Collection of materials and artifacts key to the development and history of Phoenix and the Salt River Valley

25 Heritage and Science Park (115 N. 6th St)

- Phoenix Point of Pride
- Only group of remaining residential structures from the original townsite of Phoenix
- Houses museums, gift shops and restaurants
- Pizzeria Bianco named best pizza in the country by New York food writer Ed Levine in his new book Pizza: A Slice of Heaven

26 The Rosson House Museum (113 N. 6th Street)

- Restored historic Victorian home built in 1895
- Listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1971
- Docent guided tours
